Take Ownership / Pride in Your Home

It is generally assumed that buying a Home is the biggest investment that most people ever make - so it should go without saying - take care of your investment. Most homeowners cut their grass regularly, pick-up dead tree limbs in their yard, put away their garbages\ and do not park their cars on the grass. They do everything they reasonably can to make their homes attractive on the outside because - the homes' appearance probably adds value to the property. If you are looking for a home to buy, you probably will select one that looks like it has been well taken careof: the yard and landscaping look good; the paint on the house is not peeling and so forth. While you may not be planning on selling your home anytime soon, the exterior appearance of your home can impact the neighborhood. If you have allowed your yard to become cluttered with dead tree limbs, the grass has not been cut for many weeks, your grass is over the street curb and it has not been edged - all of these factors may give the neighborhood a certain "image" that can impact nearby homes. Also, failure to correct these situations may lead to a covenant violation.

One area that is frequently overlooked - is the area between the Owner's yard or sidewalk and the street curb. Some Homeowners may feel that they do not "own" this area and therefore they are not responsible. The question of ownership may be a valid concern but generally the homeowner is responsible up to the curb which includes edging; that pine straw and trash are not allowed to accumulate in the area. Rember- pine straw allowed to accumulate in the street gutters clogs - up the drains, makes the run-off worseand it may give a negative image of your home!

Regular maintenance on the exterior of a home and the landscaping - help to maintain property values - but this takes the cooperation of **ALL NEIGHBORS. 
